In 2010 I became an international FCI-Judge for the Tibetan Terrier, in 2013 for the Frenchies, in 2014 for the St-Bernard, in 2017 for the belgian Shepherd and the Schipperkes and finally in 2018 for the Dogue de Bodeaux. I judge the Mastino Napoletano at national shows. For 3 years I was President of a Dog Show and I organised several Club-Shows. In 2009 and 2017 I was in the swiss Organising Comitee of the World Union of Saint-Bernard, indeed responsible of the Judges for the last edition. In 2017 I became a french FCI-Judge. I'm also very involved in the Junior Handling and a special Judge for the discipline.
